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### Patents, designs, trademarks, Gl's

- A patent grants protection for an invention (a new way of doing something/new technical solutions)
- A design applies to the shape and/or appearance of an article or part of a product, for example, the shape of a piece of furniture (3D) or patterns, lines or color (2D)
- A geographical indication: sign used to indication a specific geographical origin (qualities, characteristics reputation)
- A trademark: sign used by the owner on their products/services to distinguish them from the products/services of other enterprises

Need a connection with a Contracting State (resident or national)


File one application with national/regional

Office or WIPO

157 Contracting States

Contracting States grant or refuse protection (national phase)

Duration: generally 20 years





### The Hague System in a Nutshell

Need a connection with a member

■ File directly with WIPO

Can cover up to a100 designs

Can designate 96 countries

One application, one language, one currency

Designated members grant or refuse

Centralized management of rights

Limited duration – min. 15 years






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### The Lisbon System in a Nutshell

- Need a connection (must be located/ produced in a member of Lisbon)
- Must be protected in home country
- One application/language/currency (through home office/direct with declaration)
- Overall protection in 72 countries
- Members have the right to refuse
- Centralized management of rights
- Unlimited duration linked to validity of GI in home country

### The Madrid System in a Nutshell

- Need a connection with a member
- Must file through your local Office
- Need a basic mark with your local Office
- One application/language/currency
- Can designate up to 130 countries
- Can later add members
- Designated members grant or refuse
- Centralized management of rights
- Unlimited duration renew every 10 years

- Example: designating CN, DE, RU, US for a mark in color for 2 classes of goods/services
- = CHF 2,397

#### **National Route**


- Official fees for 4 countries

  - 3 x translations
  - 4 x local attorney fees
